The meeting was at Jo Anne Nelson's home. James Bohling was the artist demonstrating his acrylic art techniques in creating a landscape. He mostly works with a Palette knife and one larger brush. He used Azurite Blue and Titanium White straight out of the tube for the sky with a palette knife. He then would blend with a dry brush. He never adds water

to his paints. He darkens areas under the clouds with Payne's Grey. He was not able to complete the painting during the time allotted. He also talked about how to clean Acrylic paint brushes. You clean with pink soap and green soap from a paint store. He said to leave soap in the brush. He said also Dawn or Joy detergent would work.

This meeting was also at Jo Anne Nelson's home. Kathy Cranmer was the watercolor artist giving the demonstration. She does a lot of masking in her still life, realistic, floral painting. She masked with masking tape and masking fluid. She recommended applying the fluid with and eye glass applicator or color shapers. She used a glue residue eraser to scrape off the masking fluid after it dried.

Brushes she used were Silver Black Velvet and Escoda. The paper she used was Cold Press. She worked on a pink flower in a glass vase. She used Cobalt Teal for the glass reflection. Her extra color palette that she labeled was from Cheap Joe's.


Harvey Whitcomb is a retired Colorado Architect whose artworks center around wall-hung mosaics composed of up-cycled materials that he modifies in inventive ways.

His techniques create beauty from mundane and often discarded materials, turning trash into treasure. “I love the idea of transforming something that has been discarded into something strikingly beautiful. I began with recycled metals such as aluminum cans and old bullet casings, polishing or modifying the metal with heat or chemicals to create interesting color or textures. More recently, I have moved on to other recycled materials that can also be transformed to become something beautiful.”

He has explored metals of many types, foils, wood and is now primarily exploring a unique material he invented himself: CDs and DVD-Rs that are modified with heat and flame. Constantly experimenting with various materials, he discovered that CD's, CD-R's and DVD-R's can be modified with the flame of a small propane torch to have a marvelously jewel-like in appearance. When carefully manipulated, the metallic, mirror-like coating on the back of the discs distorts in a way that mimics precious stones and metals.

This material is very dynamically ‘alive’ in that, depending upon the viewing angle, the colors and character change constantly similar to opalescent stones. In direct sunlight the spectral colors that flash forth are just spectacular.

“My ultimate goal is create objects that speak to those parts of our minds that crave beauty and delight in color, sheen, glitter and sparkle. I am always striving to bring about exciting visual imagery that can actually alter the mood of the viewer, shifting the mood away from the mundane and creating good feelings , to give a positive visual energy to the viewer.”


