# Past Demo in August By Jill Quillian

#### JoAnn Nelson • Mixed Media Artist

Our presenter was JoAnn Nelson who has been an active artist, teacher, and part of AAG for a long time. Her word for the day was Archival. When you make the art, make it to last a long, long time. She refreshed our memories on many basic principle of fine art; line, shape, color, texture, 2D and 3D. She works mainly on wood (masonite and birch) that she puts together in her workshop for each project. She emphasized that odd sizes sell better than 16 by 20's. She puts together her work surfaces with birchboard furring strips, miter clamps and uses Titebond wood glue. Her works are mainly abstract, and she focuses on Texture. She uses Real Elmer's glue for: tissue paper, plastic scraps, fabric scraps, string, aluminum, glass, rocks, kitty litter, and wires, webbing wrap, reflector beads, etc. Anything with weight to it, needs to be applied with E6000 Glue. She also spackles and smoothes the ends of her art piece.

Her work has some collage in it, but not entirely. She puts in just enough to get your attention. If she is using canvas, she uses gesso for texture and Benjamin Moore outdoor paint as it is more archi-



val. Most of her medium is acrylic. JoAnn finishes her pieces with Rustoleum Clear Enamel spray many times; spray outside! She has also uses an auto body spray, Clear Coat, that you can buy at a car dealership. It has UV protection. She also wears brown Jersey gloves or welder gloves when working and spraying.

JoAnn enters many, many art shows and is one of our favorites. Many thanks for this valuable lesson.

We were asked to sign up to volunteer for the Gateway Show while we showed our work. Joan also encouraged people to get donations for the Gateway to the Rocky's show.




